# **AP Art & Design**

## **Work time Expectations**

Able to follow face-paced schedule that includes completing 1 artwork every 1.5 weeks. Must be able to work on artwork at home.

Investigate Materials, Processes, and Ideas

- Reflect on and document experiences to inform your art and design work
- Explore materials, processes, and ideas in your sketchbook to use in your artwork
- Connect your work to art and design traditions
- Evaluate works of art and design

Make Art & Design

- Come up with questions to guide you in creating artworks
- Use practice, experimentation, and revision
- Choose and combine materials, processes, and ideas
- Use the elements and principles of 2-D art and design

Present Art & Design

- Explain how you used materials, processes, and ideas in your work
- Describe how the work shows your skills
- Identify the questions that guided you in creating your work
- Point out how your work shows experimentation, practice, and revision
