AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMA PROGRAM - New to FCHS!

The AP Capstone Diploma program gives students the opportunity to * create original research projects while working towards a nationally recognized diploma seal from the College Board.

Students will take two courses, AP Capstone 1 (Seminar) and Capstone 2 (Research) which will guide them through investigation based research projects, both as individuals and in teams.

To receive the AP Capstone Diploma, students must pass both AP Seminar and Research plus 4 additional AP courses with a score of 3 or higher on the AP exams. You can take one or both courses without pursuing AP Capstone Diploma.

AP Capstone 1 (AP Seminar) - New for 2024-2025

AP Seminar teaches students skills in academic research and writing. * * Students are guided through a series of skill building projects in the first half of the year.

In the second half of the year, students will be working independently on their AP End of Course projects. Students create a group research project on a topic of their choice which is accompanied by a presentation. Then, students complete an individual project and presentation using materials provided by the College Board. Students complete the course with an AP Exam using a similar format to their individual written project.

Students in AP Capstone courses should be able to complete work for the course during class time unless their research project requires equipment not available during class.

DE SOCIAL STUDIES

- Starting next year, we will have two dual enrollment (DE) course offerings at FCHS
 - DE US/VA History (11th)
 - DE US Government (12th)
- These courses offer the chance to earn college credit (NVCC) without an AP exam

- You should expect 2-4 hours of homework (reading) a week
- We recommend these courses for students who are:
 - Interested in social studies and looking for a challenge
 - Taking many STEM AP classes (and their exams)



DE ENGLISH 12:

- -DE English allows you to earn college credit from NOVA
- -a good grade in the course will earn you your college credit
- -there is no AP exam
- -however, it is college-level reading and writing

- -you should expect 2-4 hours of homework (reading & writing) a week
- -at the conclusion of the course, you will have earned credit in NOVA's ENG 111 & ENG 112
- -the course helps prepare you for future college and professional writing


